### **Jouhikko for Beginners Online (Clare Zuraw)**

4 weeks - Wednesdays November 3-24, 8-9 pm

Online - video link provided to students upon registration

Fee: \$50

This class is an introduction to playing the jouhikko, a traditional Finnish bowed lyre with horsehair strings.

Students will learn how to hold and tune the instrument, use the bow, and play scales and a simple tune.

Classes will take place via group video call (Zoom) and students should have access to a device with Zoom, an internet connection that supports video calls, and the ability to record, send, and watch short videos. No experience necessary. If local students do not own a jouhikko, rental instruments will be available from instrument maker Alice Margerum in Hancock, MI for \$20 per month and a fully refundable \$120 deposit.
